3. The International Code for all calls from Hong Kong is 001.
4. The Country Code for Hong Kong is 852.
5. In some countries the Area Code may begin with the digit "0". Do not dial "0" but proceed with the following number of the Area Code.
6. Make sure you know the full international number before you start to dial.
7. Dial without pausing between digits, or the call may not be successfully connected.
8. Once you have finished dialling, it may take up to 60 seconds before the call is connected. Do not hang up until you are certain that at least one minute has elapsed.
9. Place the receiver firmly after the call is complete.
10. Service charges will be added to your bill automatically for all IDD calls.
11. A handling charge of HK\$35.00 will be applied to all toll-free and home-direct calls. This also applies when you cancel calls booked through the Operator.
12. The Hotel is not liable for bad telephone connections and will not refund or discount charges.
13. If you require any assistance or further information, please dial "0" for the Operator.

NOTICE

Loss of or Damage to Guests' Property

The liability under the Hotel Proprietors Ordinance, Cap 158, of an Hotel Proprietor to make good loss or damage to a guest's property-

- (a) extends only to the property of guests who have engaged sleeping accommodation at the hotel;
- (b) is limited to DOLLARS ONE THOUSAND (\$1000.00) for any one article and a total of DOLLARS TWO THOUSAND (\$2000.00) in the case of any one guest, except-
 - (i) in the case of property which has been deposited for safe custody in which case such liability is limited to the declared value of the property; or
 - (ii) in the case of property, the declared value of which does not exceed DOLLARS TEN THOUSAND (\$10000.00) , which has been offered for deposit;
- (c) does not cover motor cars or other vehicles of any kind or any property left in them.

This notice does not constitute an admission either that the Ordinance applies to this hotel or that liability thereunder attaches to the proprietor of this hotel in any particular case.

EMERGENCY AND FIRE PRECAUTIONS

To encourage our guests to develop good safety habits, the Hotel offers the following suggestions:

Preparation

1. Familiarise yourself with safety features of the Hotel.
2. Locate fire exits, alarms, extinguishers and fire hoses nearest to your room and know how to get to them even under adverse conditions.
3. Know how to turn off your air conditioner.
4. Know where your room key is at all times.

ACTION

1. If you are sure that there is a fire, notify the Operator by dialling Ext "0".
2. Should there be a fire in the corridor or outside your room, check the fire condition by touching the metal doorknob. Do not open the door if the doorknob is hot.
3. Should you decide to leave your room, take your room key and go to the nearest fire exit. Keep your head down and stay away from smoke.
4. Generally, fire-exit doors lead to staircases. Enter the staircase and close the door behind you. If you cannot go down or leave, use your best judgement and decide whether you should get to the roof or go back to your room.

SURVIVAL

1. Stay calm.
2. If you decided to return to or stay in your room, remember to turn off the air conditioner.
3. Fill the bath tub with water. Soak sheets and pack them around the door. Block vents from which smoke is coming out. Open windows only if you are sure fresh air is available.

In other circumstances

Whenever you are in a public area, note the location of fire exits. In case of fire or smoke, stay calm. Go to the nearest exit, and stay below the level of smoke.

IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTICE

SAFE USE OF POWER BANKS AND CHARGERS

Guests are advised to observe the following precautions when utilising power banks or electronic charging devices:

- Do not charge devices unattended, particularly when leaving the room or while sleeping.
- Charge devices only on a hard, flat, non-combustible surface (e.g. desk or table), and never on beds, pillows, sofas, carpets, or other soft furnishings.
- Ensure adequate ventilation while charging. Do not place power banks under pillows, bedding, clothing, or inside drawers, cupboards, or luggage.
- Keep power banks and chargers away from heat sources, including direct sunlight, windows, heaters, hot lamps, kettles, and other electrical appliances.
- Unplug all charging devices before retiring for the night or leaving the room, even for short periods.
- Use only certified, manufacturer-approved, and undamaged chargers, cables and power banks. Avoid counterfeit or modified devices.
- Do not charge multiple devices from a single power bank simultaneously if this causes overheating or strain on the device.
- Do not cover chargers or power banks while in use, as trapped heat can lead to thermal runaway.
- Immediately stop using and disconnect the device if a power bank becomes unusually hot, swollen, leaking, emits an odour, sparks, or makes abnormal noises.
- Keep charging devices away from water or damp areas, including bathrooms and sinks.
- Do not attempt to repair, crush, puncture, or dispose of damaged or swollen power banks. Guests should contact hotel staff immediately for safe handling and disposal.

SAFETY ADVICE

General Safety

Hong Kong can boast one of the best security records in the world for any city of a comparable size. Whether you are in the Hotel or out exploring Hong Kong, you will feel totally at ease. The reason for this is simple: both residents and visitors alike follow our recommended guidelines for safety and we suggest you do the same:

- Use the safe deposit box in your room for your valuables
- Keep a close eye on your property in public areas while sightseeing or shopping
- Carry as little cash as possible and use traveller's cheques or credit cards
- Arrange delivery of any purchases to be sent to the Front Desk and not directly to your room

Typhoon Safety

Hong Kong is occasionally subject to strong winds and heavy rain. In the event of a typhoon, you will be able to experience the full excitement and avoid its fury!

When Signal Number 3 is up, the sky may appear settled, but the weather is liable to change quickly for the worse. In these circumstances, you are advised not to cross the harbour and to keep within a reasonable distance of the Hotel. Before leaving the Hotel, remember to check with the Concierge or listen to the radio for the latest weather information.

When Signal Number 8 or above is hoisted, please remain in the Hotel and keep your windows closed at all times. Our staff will ensure your maximum comfort and our restaurants and lounges will continue to be operated as usual. For air traffic information, please contact the Concierge.

HONG KONG'S TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNALS

The typhoon warning signals are as follows:

Signal 1 (Standby)



A typhoon cyclone is centred within 800km (2-3 days away depending on its speed) of Hong Kong and it may cause destructive winds. You should take this into account when planning your activities.

Signal 3

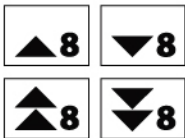


Strong winds expected or blowing with a sustained speed of 41-62 kilometres per hour (km/h) and gusts which may exceed 110km/h.

Ferry services may be affected when this signal is hoisted. Heavy rain and violent squalls may also occur at this stage.

A map indicating the movement of the typhoon will be placed in the hotel lobby for your information and will be updated from time to time.

Signal 8



When this signal is up, shutters will be pulled down to protect the windows at the hotel entrance. For your safety, guests are advised to draw the curtains in their rooms and stay inside the hotel.

Ferries will not be in service and special arrangements for other public transportation, eg MTR, buses and mini-buses will be announced through local television and radio channels.

Signal 9 and 10



The centre of the typhoon will come close to Hong Kong. Stay away from exposed windows and doors. No air service is available when these signals are up.

If you are departing Hong Kong, please be advised to check with the Concierge for the latest flight information.

Our associates will be at your service to ensure your maximum comfort and safety. Our restaurants will be operated as usual. Should you require any assistance, please contact the Duty Manager through the Operator at ext 0.

HONG KONG'S RAINSTORM SIGNALS

GUIDE FOR THE RAINSTORM SIGNALS

There are three levels of warning: AMBER, RED and BLACK. The AMBER signal gives an alert about potential heavy rain that may develop into RED or BLACK signal situations. There will be flooding in some low-lying and poorly drained areas. The RED and BLACK signals warn the public of heavy rain which is likely to bring about serious road flooding and traffic congestion. The public will be given clear advice on the appropriate action to take.

Once issued, the signals are broadcast over radio and television. For your own safety, please contact the Concierge or listen to local radio or television announcements for the latest information.



AMBER rainstorm signal

Heavy rain has fallen or is expected to fall generally over Hong Kong, exceeding 30 millimetres in an hour. Members of the public should take necessary precautions to reduce their exposure to risks posed by heavy rain, such as flooding.



RED rainstorm signal

Heavy rain has fallen or is expected to fall generally over Hong Kong, exceeding 50 millimetres in an hour, and is likely to continue. People who have to travel should carefully consider weather and road conditions.



BLACK rainstorm signal

Very heavy rain has fallen or is expected to fall generally over Hong Kong, exceeding 70 millimetres in an hour, and is likely to continue. Please stay indoors or take shelter in a safe place until the heavy rain has passed.
